2. I am directed to state that the following are the submissions with
regard to subject petition:-

- i. That Sindh Police is mind full of the security concerns and
threat perceptions regarding security of educational institutions
specially in the wake of incidents of terrorism occurred at
Army Public School, Peshawar and Charsada University,
Mardan. In order to counter the threats and to provide security
to educational institutions in the Province of Sindh, Sindh
Police conducted the survey of all educational institutions in
the Province through Special Branch and through field units of
Sindh Police. The survey of following institutions have been
completed so far:-

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- ii. Special Branch has been tasked to conduct a security audit of the educational institutions and to identify the loop holes in their security and to sensitize the management / administration of these institutions about such lapses and also brief them that how security arrangements can be improved at their home.
 - iii. Further field units were also directed to convene meetings with the administration of educational institutions and apprise them regarding the threats and to ensure that proper measures have been taken by these education institutions for their security.
 - iv. It is not possible to provide Police personnel for security of all educational institutions, field units were directed to divide their area of jurisdiction into clusters where majority of educational institutions are located and to prepare security plan to ensure extensive Police patrolling at the opening and closing hours of the institutions which is continuously being done without fail.
3. Following further security measures are recommended for improvement of security of educational institutions:-

- Geo Tagging of all Educational institutions in Sindh.
- Boundary Walls should be raised up to high level to avoid wall crossing.
- CCTV cameras should be installed at all the entry/exit points with recording.
- Watchtower should be established.
- Effective patrolling by LEAs should be ensured around the educational Institutions.
- If possible then there may be one entry/exit point. All other gates may be closed.
- Broken boundary walls should be repaired immediately.
- There should be frequent sweeping of the area by Bomb Disposal teams.
- Big groups of the students should not be gathered.
- Exercises of evacuation to the students from the class rooms or the building of the college against terrorist activity be also carried out on monthly basis in educational institutions.
- Any other precaution if required should be taken immediately.
- Fire brigade vehicle and equipment be also there in ready position and in close co-ordination with educational institutions.
