

  - 2. Needless to state that in case of non-compliance by the K-Electric Authorities, the NEPRA Authorities would be at liberty to take appropriate action in accordance with law against the K-Electric Authorities.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the directions given by this court have not been complied with by the Respondents No. 4 & 5, so also by the alleged contemnors.

In the first instance, let report be called from the alleged contemnors with regard to the compliance of order dated 29.05.2017, to be submitted on or before next date of hearing. Issue notices to the alleged contemnors.

# AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF THE APPLICATION UNDER SECTIONS 3, 6 & 12, OF THE CONTEMPT OF COURT ORDINANCE, 2003, READ WITH, ARTICLE 204 OF THE CONSTITUTION, 1973

I, Nazim Fida Hussain Haji, son of Fida Hussain Haji, Muslim, Adult, resident of House No. A-21/2-A, KDA Scheme 1 A, Extension, Stadium Road, Karachi, holding CNIC No. 42801-06232695, do hereby state on oath as under:

- 1. That I am the Petitioner No.2, in the present Petition and I am well conversant with the facts of this case.
- 2. That the accompanying Application has been filed and drafted under my instructions and for the sake of brevity, the contents of the accompanying Application under Sections 3, 6 & 12, of the Contempt of Court Ordinance, 2003, Read With, Article 204 of the Constitution, 1973, may be read as a part of this Affidavit.
- 3. That the present Petition was filed to seek, inter alia, the implementation High NEPRA's Decision dated: 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2016, [annexed to the Memo of Petition as Annex 'A', Page 67] against K-Electric in the matter of Show

SVANT RESISTRAR-NOT & IDENTITY BRANCH SH COURT OF SINDH Cause Notice dated: 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2015, regarding excessive and discriminatory load shedding by K-Electric during the onslaught of heat wave in the year, 2015. The present Petition was disposed of by this Honourable Court through Order dated: 29.05.2017 and the following two distinct and independent directions were given to NEPRA [Respondent No.4] and K-Electric Limited [Respondent No.5], respectively:

"We, therefore, dispose of this petition by giving directions as under:

- 1) That the NEPRA Authorities, being regulator of the K-Electric, are directed to make sure that the instructions issued by it vide order on the above-noted show cause notice dated March 25, 2016 are being complied with by the K-Electric Authorities in its letter and spirit.
- 2) Needless to state that in case of non-compliance by the K-Electric Authorities, the NEPRA Authorities would be at liberty to take appropriate action in accordance with law against the K-Electric Authorities.

Petition stands disposed of in the above terms along with the listed applications".

4. That as stated in the first direction of the aforementioned Order, NEPRA was directed to make sure that the instructions issued by it through NEPRA's Decision dated: 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2016, are complied with in its letter and spirit. It is submitted that the Alleged Contemnors, representing NEPRA and K-Electric have miserably, deliberately, willfully and malafidely failed to ensure that the instructions issued by NEPRA in its Decision dated: 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2016, are complied with by K-Electric, which can be observed from the following:



a. Firstly, in Para 37(ii) of the NEPRA'S Decision, it has been categorically and unequivocally directed that if K-Electric (KE) continues with the practice of reducing or underutilizing its generation capacity, strict punitive action will be taken against it in

future. However, a Press Release issued by NEPRA on 17<sup>th</sup> April, 2018, clearly reflects, through its Para 3, 4 and 5, that K-Electric had been underutilizing Bin Qasim Power Station (BQPS I), whereas it could have been operated at full capacity to minimize load shedding. Furthermore, due to poor maintenance plan and unplanned outage, generation capacity is reduced. It is obvious from the aforementioned observations of NEPRA in its Press Release that firstly, K-Electric has completely violated the directions given in Para 37(ii) of NEPRA's Decision by reducing and underutilizing its generation capacity and secondly, in the span of over one year since the passing of the Order dated: 29.05.2017 by this Honourable Court, the Alleged Contemnors No.6 and No.7, representing NEPRA have utterly failed to take any action against K-Electric and against Alleged Contemnors No. 1 to No. 5 for violation of the said NEPRA's Decision.

b. Secondly, through Para 37(v) of the NEPRA'S Decision, KElectric has been categorically and unequivocally directed to
increase its generation capacity and improve its transmission and
distribution system strictly in accordance with the investment plans
submitted by and attached as Annexure-A to the decision (Page
103 to 105). However, a Press Release issued by NEPRA on 17<sup>th</sup>
April, 2018, clearly reflects, through Para 4 and 5, evidence of KElectric's poor maintenance plan, load management, faults adding
to the unplanned load shedding and fragile distribution system. It is
important to submit that such poor maintenance plan is clearly
violative of the aforementioned investment plan submitted by KElectric, which categorically specifies that investment had to be
made by K-Electric for the purposes of rehabilitation and





enhancement of distribution and transmission network, cable replacements, maintenance of hotspot on feeders, expansion and rehabilitation of grid stations, replacement of fatigued switches, preventive maintenance of 151 feeders, replacement of 22 cable links, and preventive maintenance of 1540 transformers. It is obvious from the aforementioned observation of NEPRA in its Press Release that firstly, K-Electric has completely violated the directions given in Para 37(v) of NEPRA's Decision by failing to take steps in relation to the maintenance and secondly, in the span of over one year since the passing of the Order dated: 29.05.2017 by this Honourable Court, the Alleged Contemnors No.6 and No.7, representing NEPRA have utterly failed to take any action against K-Electric and against Alleged Contemnors No. 1 to No. 5 for violation of the said NEPRA's Decision.

c. Thirdly, the violation of Para 37(ii) and 37(v) are also obvious from the fact that there is public outrage, which is widely reported in news clippings, over excessive load shedding in Karachi, in the hottest weather of the year and in the month of Ramadan, and because of such excessive load shedding, the citizens of Karachi are literally living in hell.

The aforementioned facts clearly prove that not only K-Electric and the Alleged Contemnors No.1 to No.5 have violated Para 1 of the operative part of the Order dated: 29.05.2017 of this Honourable Court by failing to abide by the instructions given in the NEPRA's Decision dated: 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2016, but Alleged Contemnors No. 6 and No.7 representing

NEPRA have also violated the said Order by failing to take any action against K-Electric over the last one year.

A copy of the NEPRA's Press Release dated: 17.04.2018 and newspaper clippings is annexed and marked as Annex 'AX' to 'AX-3'.

- 5. That as stated above, the directions given in Para 2 of the Order dated: 29.05.2017 are independent and distinct from the directions given in Para 1 of the operative part of the said Order. Para 2 of the operative part of the Order dated: 29.05.2017 begins with the word "needless", which clearly imposes an independent responsibility upon the Alleged Contemnors No.6 and No.7 representing NEPRA to take appropriate action against K-Electric in case of non-compliance. It is obvious from the aforementioned facts that the Alleged Contemnors No.6 to No.7, representing NEPRA are responsible for willful and deliberate failure to take any action against the non-compliance of its own Decision dated: 25th March, 2016.
  - 6. That it is important to submit that the Alleged Contemnor No.1 being the Chief Executive Officer of K-Electric was responsible for ensuring compliance of the Order dated: 29.05.2017, by following the instructions given in the NEPRA'S Decision dated: 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2016. The responsibility to ensure compliance of Para 37(ii) of NEPRA's Decision, by ensuring that there is no reduction and/or underutilization of generation capacity lies with the Alleged Contemnors No.1, 2 and No.5 who are responsible, for inter alia, generation of electricity. The responsibility to ensure compliance of Para 37(v) of NEPRA's Decision by ensuring that electricity is distributed through well-maintained channels, plants, feeders and cables in accordance with the maintenance plan specified in the investment plan attached as Annexure -A to NEPRA's Decision, lies with the Alleged Contemnors No.1, 3 and 4, who are responsible for distribution of electric power and supply. It is important to submit that

Order dated: 29.05.2017 records the statement made by the Alleged Contemnors No. 4 and No.5 ['Mr. Amir Zia' and 'Mr. Muhammad Adil'] that NEPRA's Decision will be complied with in accordance with law, which clearly shows that the said Alleged Contemnors had knowledge of the Order dated: 29.05.2017 as well as the fact that an undertaking was given by them on the basis of which the Order dated: 29.05.2017 was passed, which undertaking has been willfully and deliberately violated. Furthermore, the responsibility to ensure that the aforementioned NEPRA's Decision is complied with in letter and spirit lies with the Alleged Contemnors No. 6 and No.7. It is amply clear from the aforementioned facts that all the Alleged Contemnors have willfully, deliberately and malafidely violated the Order dated: 29.05.2017 by failing to ensure compliance of NEPRA's Decision dated: 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2016.

7. That it is respectfully submitted that the statement made by NEPRA in its Press Release dated: 17<sup>th</sup> April, 2018, to the effect that legal action will be taken by it against K-Electric is only a pretence and farce when in fact both K-Electric and NEPRA i.e. the Alleged Contemnors are acting in collusion with each other, which is obvious from the fact that in the span of over one year and in the present electricity crisis, NEPRA has not taken any action against K-Electric. It is further most respectfully submitted, for the sake of disclosure, that the Petitioners intend to file Intervener Application in HRC No. 20883 of 2018 (in the matter regarding excessive load shedding in Sindh) before the Honourable Supreme Court, to bring on record the facts stated in the present Petition. However, the issues and controversies raised in the said HRC No. 20883 of 2018 are distinct and separate from the issues involved in the present Contempt Application.
