Learned counsel for the NEPRA has filed statement along with order passed by the NEPRA on review application of the plaintiff and some other applicants. Basically, this suit was filed for some restraining order against the defendants not to take any action till decision of the review which has been disposed of. In my view, virtually the suit has achieved its purpose and if the plaintiff is aggrieved by the review order they may avail appropriate remedy in accordance with law. Learned counsel for the plaintiff submits that the plaintiff may challenge the review order, therefore, he requests that some time may be allowed to seek appropriate remedy and till then the NEPRA may be restrained not to take any action. The suit is disposed of accordingly, however, the plaintiff may avail appropriate remedy to challenge the order in review if they are found aggrieved. Till seven days only no action shall be taken against the plaintiff by the NEPRA.
